SIR,

WE have the honor to submit to Your Excellency the decennial Census Returns of the Population of this Island, taken on the night of the 24th April last. A return of Live Stock was also taken at the same time.

To enable us to arrive at accurate and conclusive figures, it was thought wise to adopt the system used by the Census Supervisors in 1911, and to again employ, where possible, all Enumerators who served at that time, their knowledge thus gained being of great assistance to us. Having decided on this course we feel confident that the Returns given herewith are as accurate as it is possible for them to be; and that the twenty Enumerators carried out their duties thoroughly.

The total number of persons in this Colony on the Census night amounted to 3747, and were made up as follows:—

The total compared with 1911 (3477, exclusive of shipping) shows an increase of 270 persons. This increase is due partly to the arrival of a small Garrison and Deportees during the last decade, and to the fact that the large excess of Births over Deaths (564) more than counteracts the decrease of Immigrants under Emigrants (369). There was no shipping in Port when the Census was taken.

The population per square mile works out at 79.7 persons as against 74 in 1911.

Taking the Civil Population at 3666 on Census night and allowing for 22 Births and 22 Immigrants from the 1st January to 24th April, and 7 Deaths and 47 Emigrants during the same period, would place the civil population on the 31st December, 1920, at 3676 persons, whereas the estimated figure on that date as given in the Blue Book was 3718—an excess of 42 persons. A Comparative Statement of Civil Population, for the Censuses of 1911-1921 is as follows :—

giving an increase of 189 civilians in the last 10 years.

On Table No. 5 it will be seen that there were 1122 persons returned as "Married," i.e., 518 male and 604 female; 163 as "Widowed" and 2462 as "Single." Out of the latter figure 1270 were under the age of 14 years. Many married men were absent from the Colony doing service in Ascension Island and South Africa, also serving in H. M. Navy and Cable Ships, hence the predominant number of "Married" females returned. A Comparative Statement of the above figures with those of the previous Census is given herewith :—

Dealing with "Religions" on Table No. 5 it will be noted that the term "Anglican" is used and not

“Church of England” as in previous Reports ; and it will be seen below that this Denomination comprises over 86 per cent. of the population.

Table No. 10 gives the number of Scholars on the Public School Rolls as 612 as compared with 675 in 1911, giving a decrease of 63. There are also about a dozen children receiving private elementary tuition. As there were 1270 children returned under 14 years of age, it is presumed that about 646 are under school age.

The number of houses occupied according to the Census Schedules were 701, and unoccupied 87, as compared with 574 and 82 respectively in 1911. A number of small dwellings have been erected during the last ten years, especially in the vicinity of the Flax Mills. In 1911 there were 796 families to whom Census Schedules were issued, as against 840 families (excluding the Garrison and Deportees) and a like number of Schedules, in the current year. The figures relating to accommodation of the population will be found on Table No. 8, and a statement of accommodation for 1911-1921 is as follows :—

The return of Live Stock can be taken as fairly accurate, with the exception of "Goats." Very few owners of these elusive animals can give a satisfactory return, and the number might be reasonably increased by 30 per cent. It will be seen on Table 9, that there is a decrease under all other heads. The large decrease under Sheep is partly due to the small farmer having, in the hard times experienced during the War, killed or otherwise disposed of his flock, and also to a large number being shipped to Ascension during the last decade.

The acreage of land returned as being in the possession of Householders on the night of the 24th April was 7221 as compared with 7220 in 1911.
