She lives in one of the small cottages in a remote area of the Island called Blue Hill and was for many years a very regular worshipper at the lovely Church which was built there during the time when Gilbert Turner

Bishop of the Diocese.

She lives with one of her daughters and apart from increasing deafness, she possesses all her faculties and has a great sense of humour. She refuses to wear spectacles, resists any suggestion that she should ever receive medical attention and insists on cooking the porridge for breakfast each morning.

On the occasion of her recent birthday the Bishop asked her what was the first thing she could remember. He thought that Mrs. Buckley might be able to recall some interesting event in the Island's history or perhaps some important visitor whom she may have met in her younger days.

But without any hesitation she simply made the reply - "Having to work very hard!"
